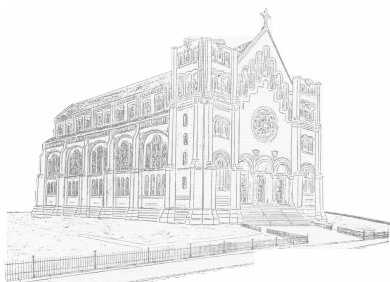

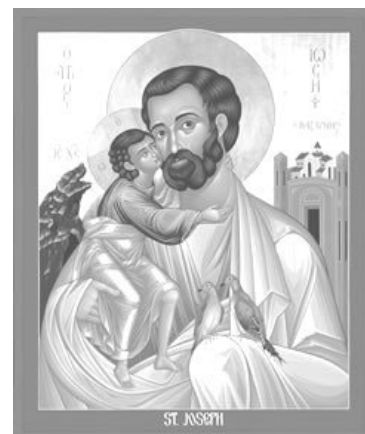

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "Remember your last days, set enmity aside" (Sirach 27:30-28:7)

Psalm — "Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all my being, bless His holy name (Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12)

Second Reading — "Christ died and came to life, that He might be Lord of both the dead and the living" (Romans 14:7-9)

Gospel — "I say to you not seven times but seventy-seven times" (Matthew 18:21-35)

The Feast of St Matthew-Saint Matthew, the first-century tax collector turned apostle who chronicled the life and ministry of Christ in his Gospel, is celebrated by the Church on September 21. Although relatively little is known about the life of St. Matthew, the account he wrote of Christ's ministry is of inestimable value to the Church, particularly in its verification of Jesus as the Messiah. A witness to Christ's resurrection after death, as well as his ascension into heaven and the events of Pentecost, Matthew also recorded Jesus' instruction for the apostles to "go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."
