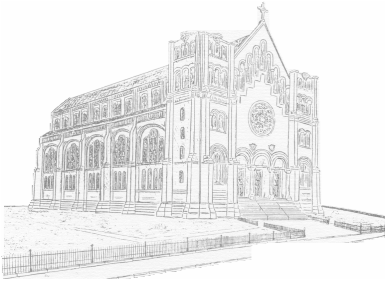

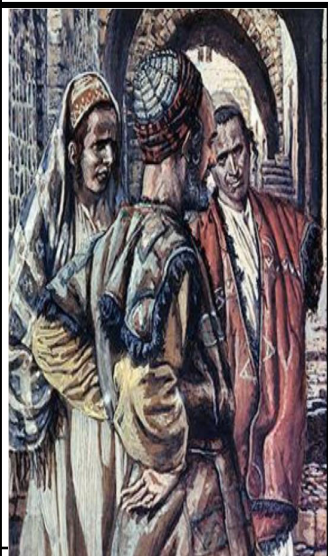

The Parable Of The Two Sons

**Matthew
21:28-32**

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — “But if he turns away from the wickedness he has committed...he will preserve his life.” (Ezekiel 18:26-28)

Psalm — “Good and upright is the Lord; thus He shows sinners the Way.” (Psalm 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9)

Second Reading — “Because of the God greatly exalted Him and bestowed upon Him a name which is above every name” (Philippians 2:1-11)

Gospel — “When John came to you in the way of righteousness you did not believe him” (Matthew 21:28-32)

The Feast of St Francis of Assisi- Francis of Assisi OFM, was an Italian mystic and Catholic friar who founded the Franciscans. He was inspired to lead a life of poverty as an itinerant preacher. One of the most venerated figures in Christianity, Francis was canonized by Pope Gregory IX on 16 July 1228. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land .Francis is associated with patronage of animals and the environment. It became customary for churches to hold ceremonies blessing animals on his feast day of 4 October. He is known for devotion to the Eucharist. Along with Catherine of Siena, he was designated patron saint of Italy.
