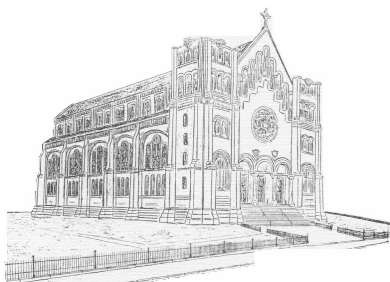

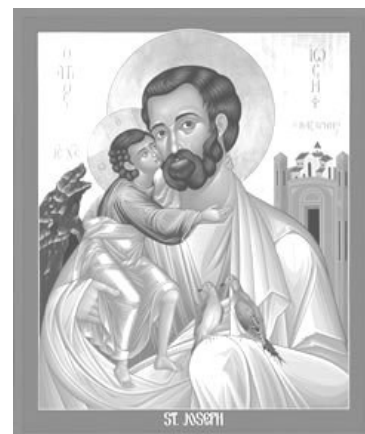

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — “Now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard.” (Isiah 5:1-7)

The Feast of St Denis of Paris- Denis of Paris was a 3rd-century Christian martyr and saint. He he was bishop of Paris (then Lutetia) in the third century and, together with his companions Rusticus and Eleutherius, was martyred for his faith by decapitation. He is venerated in the Catholic Church as the patron saint of France and Paris and is accounted one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers. A chapel was raised at the site of his burial by a local Christian woman; it was later expanded into an abbey and basilica, around which grew up the French city of Saint-Denis, now a suburb of Paris. His feast day is celebrated on October 9th
