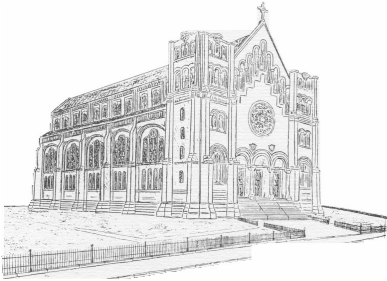

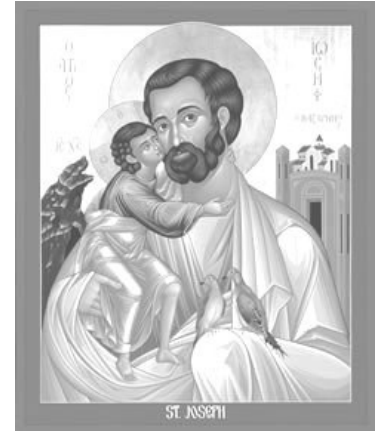

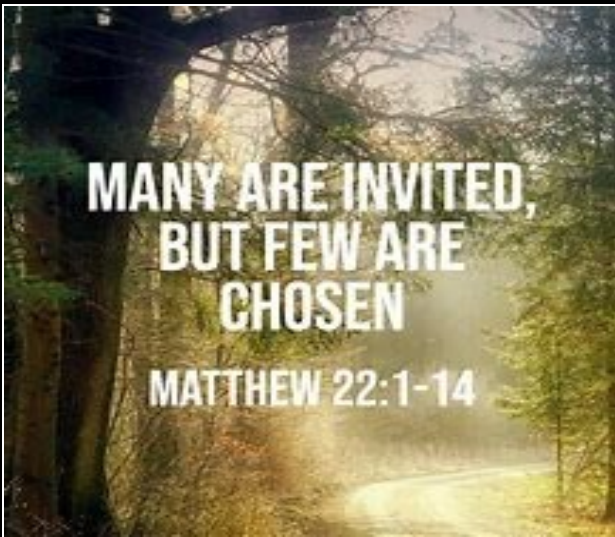

TODAY’S READINGS

First Reading — “The Lord God will wipe away the tears from every face.” (Isiah 25:6-10a)

Psalm — “Only goodness and kindness follow me all the days of my life...” (Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6)

Second Reading — “I can do all things in him who strengthens me.” (Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20)

Gospel — “Then he said to his servants, “The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come...”” (Matthew 22:1-10)

The Feast of St Luke- St. Luke the evangelist was the author of the gospel according to Luke and The Acts of the Apostles. He was a companion of St. Paul the Apostle, whom he joined on multiple missionary trips and assisted in con-verting proselytes to the Christian faith. St. Luke was also a physician, painter, and he may have been a Gentile. He preached the gospel in various places including Egypt and Greece. Catholic scholars believe St. Luke died at age 84 of natural causes whereas Orthodox scholars contend he was martyred by hanging on an olive tree. St. Luke’s feast day is celebrated on October 18th.
