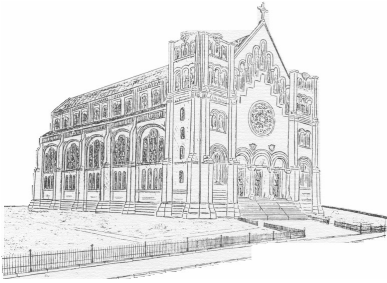

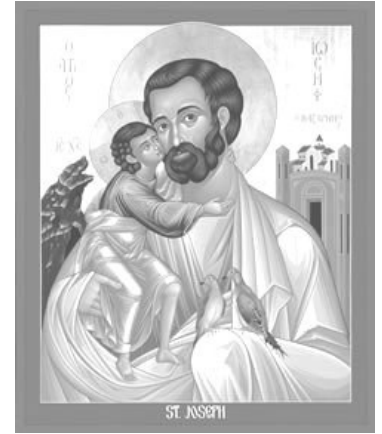

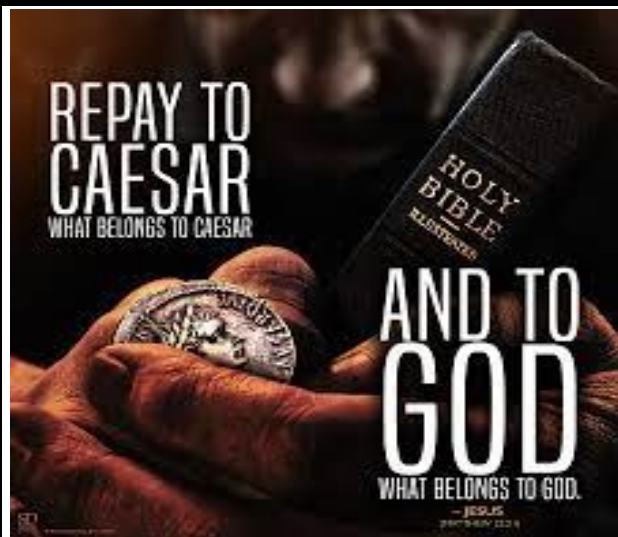

**TODAY’S READINGS**

**First Reading** — “I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not.” (Isiah 45:1,4-6)

**Psalm** — “For great is the Lord and highly to be praised, awesome is he, beyond all gods.” (Psalm 96:1,3, 4-5, 7-8, 9-10)

**Second Reading** — “We give thanks to God always for all of you, remembering you in our prayers...” (1Thes 1:2-5b)

**Gospel** — “Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God” (Matthew 22:15-21)

**The Feast of Sts. Simon & Jude– Sts. Simon and Jude** were among the 12 disciples of Jesus. Both of these men were known by other names during their lives. Simon was often called “the Zealot.” A zealot is a person who is strongly committed to something. In Simon’s case, he firmly believed in the importance of people following Jewish law. Once he met Jesus, his life was changed and he became convinced that the most important thing was to follow Jesus and his teachings. Jude was also known as “Jude Thaddeus.” People used this formal title so that he was not confused with Judas, the apostle who betrayed Jesus and handed him over to be arrested. Jude is the patron saint of hopeless cases and desperate situations. People often pray to Jude when they feel that there is no one else to turn to. They ask Jude to bring their problem to Jesus. Their feast day is October 28th.
