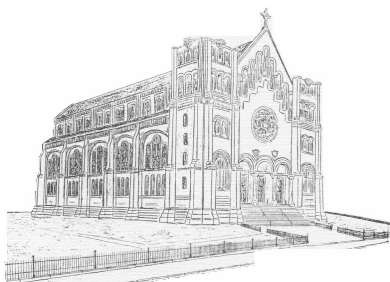

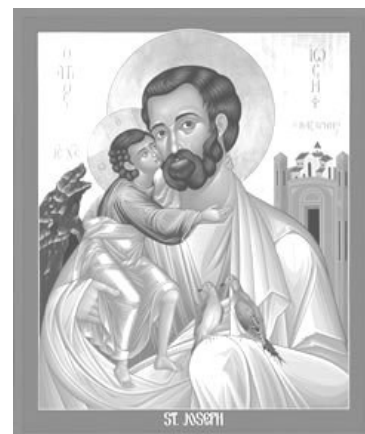

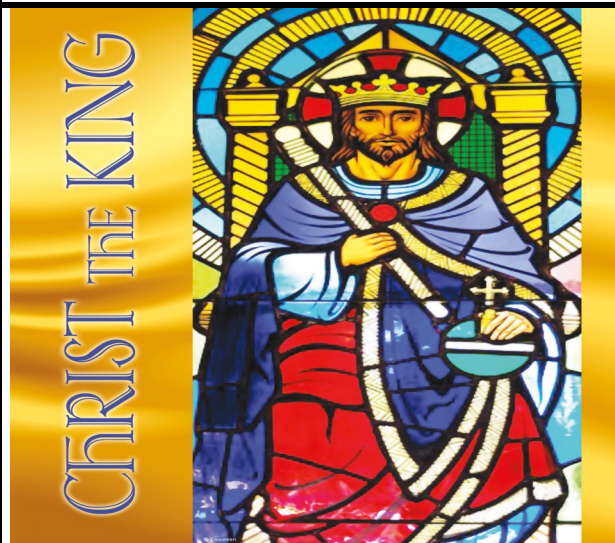

**Beloved St. Anthony visits New Orleans-** The Franciscan Friars from Padua, Italy, invite you to join them in welcoming Saint Anthony of Padua to the Catholic Archdiocese of New Orleans, LA. St. Anthony will be visiting the area in the form of "two precious and first class relics" from the Pontifical Basilica in Padua, Italy. The relics will be accompanied by Fr. Mario Conte, a Franciscan Friar from Padua, Italy, where the Saint is buried. Masses will take place on Saturday December 2nd at St. Anthony of Padua Church located at 4640 Canal Street. The 9am mass will be in Spanish. The 12pm and 4pm masses will be celebrated in English. Veneration 10am-5pm.



### TODAY'S READINGS

**First Reading** — "I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats." (Ez 34:11-12, 15-17)

**Psalm** — "You spread the table before me in the sight of my foes" (Psalm 23: 1-2, 2-3, 5-6)

**Second Reading** — "For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man." (1Cor 12:20-26, 28)

**Gospel** — "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did to the least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:31-46)

**The Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle-** St. Andrew was one of the twelve main disciples of Jesus Christ and the brother of Simon Peter. Andrew was the first apostle Jesus called and the first apostle to claim Jesus was the Messiah. Andrew is *Andreas* in Greek, coming from the root word *aner* or *andros*, meaning "man." The name is related to *andreia*, meaning "courage," and it's most often defined as "manly." Like his brother Simon Peter and several of the other disciples, Andrew was a fisherman. Jesus first encounters Andrew when he's fishing near the shore of the Sea of Galilee with Peter. Tradition holds that Andrew was martyred by crucifixion in the Greek city of Patras around 60 AD. Andrew allegedly didn't consider himself worthy to die in the same way as Jesus, and tradition claims he was bound to a cross which was hung in an X shape instead of a T. His feast day is November 30th.
