**TODAY'S READINGS** 

**First Reading** — "Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance." (Is. 60:1-6)

**Gospel** — "And you Bethlehem of Judea, are by no means the least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel" (Mt 2:1-12)

**The Epiphany of the Lord-**In the Latin rite of the Catholic Church, Epiphany celebrates the revelation that Jesus was the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Three Wise Men, but it also focuses on his baptism in the Jordan and at the wedding at Cana. In the Eastern rites of the Catholic Church, Theophany — as Epiphany is known in the East — commemorates the

manifestation of Jesus' divinity at his baptism in the River Jordan. While the traditional date for the feast is Jan. 6, in the United States the celebration of Epiphany is moved to the Sunday between Jan. 2 and Jan. 8. The Western Church separated the feasts of the Nativity, Magi visitation, Baptism of Jesus and Wedding at Cana into their own celebrations, leaving the celebration of the Epiphany to commemorate primarily the visitation of the Magi to see the newborn Christ on Jan. 6.
