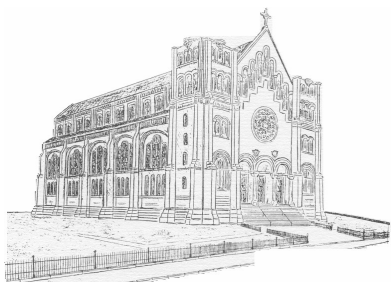

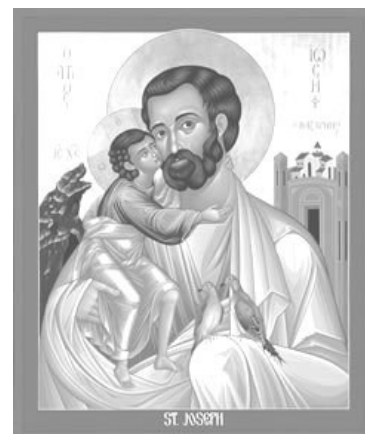

TODAY'S READINGS
