



National Eucharistic Revival -New Orleans The National Eucharistic Revival will culminate this year in two major national events: Four cross-country eucharistic pilgrimages beginning from the North, South, East and West and converging at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis to be held July 17-21 of this year. All of the available details about these events can be found at https://www.eucharisticrevival.org.The Archdiocese of New Orleans is on the Southern, "Juan Diego," pilgrimage route. We will welcome the pilgrims from June 7-9, 2024. On Friday June 7, beginning at 6:30 p.m., there will be a public eucharistic procession from the steps of Notre Dame Seminary and proceeding to St. Rita Church on Lowerline Street. The procession will be followed by a time of eucharistic adoration with music provided by The Vigil Project and a reflection by one of the perpetual pilgrims.
