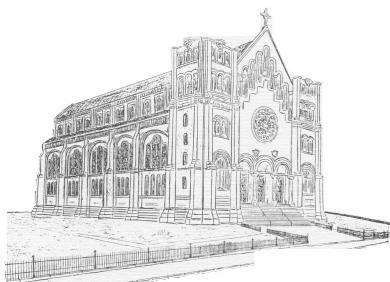

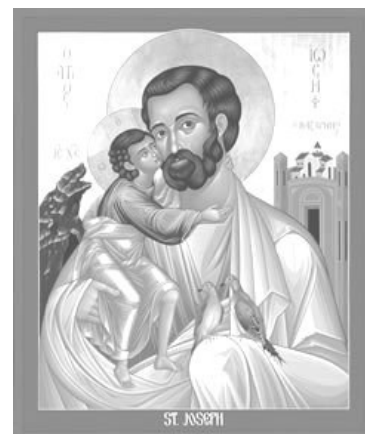

Lead Testing Study in Orleans Parish

The Water Collaborative of Greater New Orleans (TWC) is a regional leader in urban water management and climate adaptation strategies, dedicated to addressing water concerns. Lead pipes pose a substantial public health hazard across the United States, particularly in cities like New Orleans, characterized by aging infrastructure and legacy pipelines. Homes constructed before the state banned lead plumbing materials in 1988 are more likely to have lead service lines. Immediate action is crucial to understand this issue within our community's water system and advocate for equitable replacement, given Louisiana is estimated to have over 250,000 lead service lines remaining in place.

Our primary goal is to empower the community by sharing crucial insights into lead exposure and educating individuals on effective mitigation strategies. Following data collection and analysis, we aim to share this crucial information with residents, water utilities, state agencies, and community partners.
