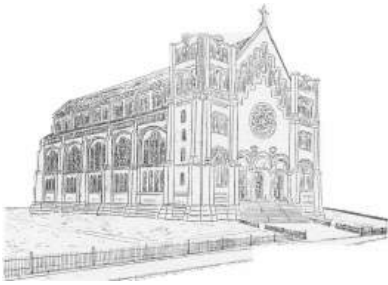

TODAY’S READINGS

First Reading — “In your observance of the commandments of the Lord, your God, which I enjoin upon you, you shall not add to what I command nor subtract from it.” (Dt 4:1-2, 6-8)

Psalm — “Who lends not his money at usury and accepts no bribe against the innocent.” (Ps 15:2-3, 3-4, 4-5)

Second Reading — “Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves.” (Jas 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27)

Catholic Social Teaching– The Dignity of Work & the Rights of Workers This Labor day we are reminded of the Church’s stance on the dignity of work and the rights of workers. The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God’s creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected-- the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative.

In response to the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Archdiocese of New Orleans continues to make the Hot Line available for anyone who has been hurt or sexually abused by anyone who works for the Church.
