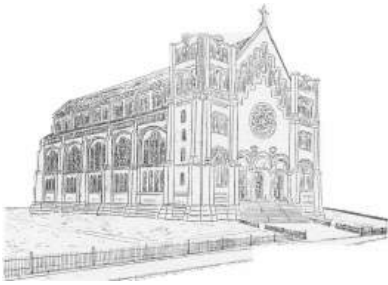

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — “Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets!” (Nm 11:25-29)

Psalm — “From wanton sin especially, restrain your servant; let it not rule over me.” (Ps 19:8, 10, 12-13, 14)

Second Reading — “Behold, the wages you withheld from the workers who harvested your fields are crying aloud’ and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts“ (Jas 5:1-6)

Gospel — “Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward..” (Mk 9:38-43, 45,47-48)

St. Francis of Assisi was born circa 1181, in Assisi, duchy of Spoleto, Italy. He was captured and imprisoned for ransom after fighting in a battle between Assisi and Perugia. He spent nearly a year in prison where he began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, Francis heard the voice of Christ, who told him to repair the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. Later in life, Francis reportedly received a vision that left him with the stigmata of Christ, making Francis the first person to receive such holy wounds. He was canonized as a saint on July 16, 1228. During his life he also developed a deep love of nature and animals and is known as the patron saint of the environment and animals. Francis of Assisi died on October 3, 1226, at the age of 44, in Assisi, Italy. In 2013, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio chose to honor Saint Francis by taking his name, becoming Pope Francis.

CHARTER FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

In response to the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Archdiocese of New Orleans continues to make the Hot Line available for anyone who has been hurt or sexually abused by anyone who works for the Church.
