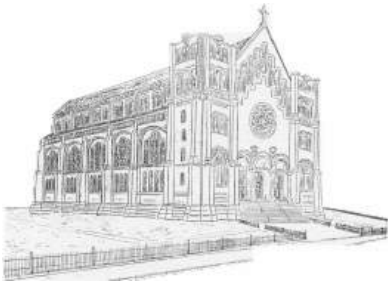

**Historical Marker to be Unveiled-** The 19th Century Ursuline Convent located in the Ninth Ward will have an engraved plaque to mark the place it originally stood at the intersection of Dauphine and Sister Streets. The massive complex, built 200 years ago, is where hundreds of daughters of New Orleans' families were educated by Ursuline nuns. The complex was expropriated to rebuild a levee wall and to construct the Inner Harbor Navigation Canal. An unveiling ceremony and reception will take place today Sunday, October 27th at 3:00pm. 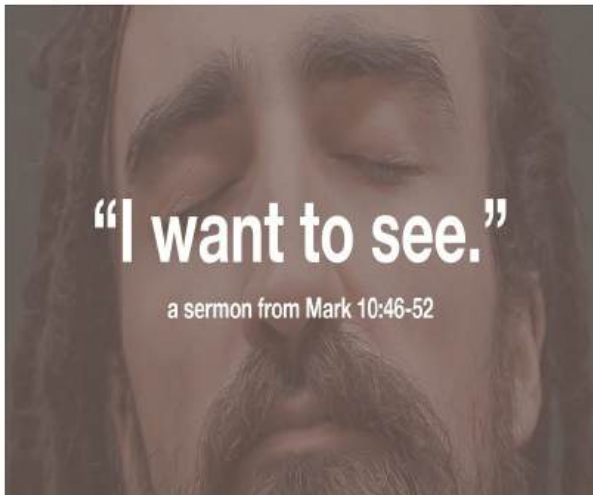

We invite everyone in the community who has been affected by any type of violence to participate in this Mass.
