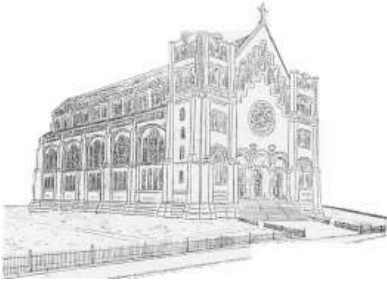

TODAY’S READINGS

First Reading — “Fear the Lord, your God, and keep , throughout the days of your lives, all his statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you.” (Dt 6:2-6)

Psalm — “Praised be the Lord, I exclaim, and I am safe from my enemies.” (Ps 18:2-3, 3-4, 47,51)

Second Reading — “He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day...” (Heb 7:23-28)

Gospel — “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” (Mk 12:28b-34)

St Charles Borromeo- Saint Charles Borromeo was born on October 2, 1538 at the castle of Arona on Lake Maggiore near Milan. His father was the Count of Arona and his mother a member of the House of Medici. At the age of 12, the young Count Charles Borromeo dedicated himself to a life of service to the Church. In 1554 his father passed away and although Charles was a teenager, responsibility for his household fell to him. Charles continued in his studies and earned a doctorate in canon and civil law. Borromeo was ordained first to the order of deacon. Then, he was ordained to the holy priesthood on September 4, 1563. Then, he was ordained as a bishop on December 7, 1563. He became Archbishop of Milan in May 12, 1564. The driving out of corruption was a critical matter during Borromeo's time. His strategy was to provide education to many clergy he saw as ignorant. He founded schools and seminaries and colleges for clergy. St. Charles Borromeo's feast day is celebrated on November 4. He is the patron of bishops, catechists, Lombardy, Italy, Monterey, California, cardinals, seminarians, and spiritual leaders.
