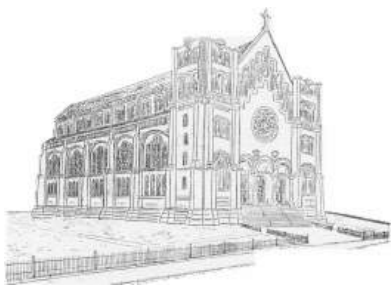

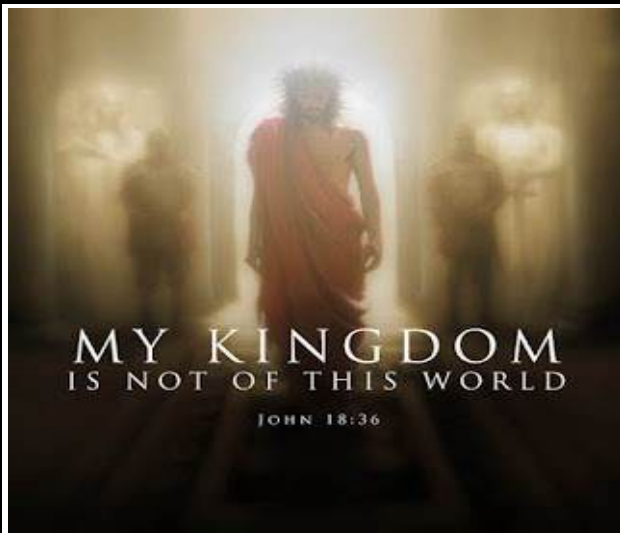

TODAY’S READINGS

First Reading — “His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away, his kingship shall not be destroyed.” (Dn 7:13-14)

Psalm — “The Lord is king, in splendor robed; robed is the Lord and girt about with strength..” (Ps 93:1, 1-2, 5)

Second Reading — “Behold, he is coming amid the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those that pierced him..“ (Rv 1:5-8)

Gospel — “For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth.” (Jn 18:33b-37)

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King- The Feast of Christ the King, established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, serves as a reminder of Christ's universal kingship. It was introduced in response to the rise of secularism, atheism, and political turmoil in the early 20th century. Pope Pius XI recognized the danger of pushing Jesus Christ and His law out of public life, which could lead to discord and chaos among nations and individuals. The Church calls on believers to acknowledge Christ's kingship not just privately but also publicly, living out their faith fully. The Feast of Christ the King holds significant importance in the liturgical calendar, reminding believers of Christ's dominion over all aspects of their lives and the world. It emphasizes that Christ is not just for private devotion but a universal and eternal King who deserves honor, glory, and faith from all people.
