



TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "The Lord has removed the judgment against you he has turned away your enemies." (Zep 3:14-18a)

Psalm — "Sing praise to the Lord for his glorious achievement; let this be know throughout all the earth." (Is 12:2-3,4, 5-6)

Second Reading — "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, b prayer and petition make your requests known to God. (Phil 4:4-7)

Gospel — "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming." (Lk 3:10-18)

The Third Sunday of AdventThe third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "rejoice." Some people mark this Sunday on their Advent wreath with a pink candle instead of a purple candle. This Sunday is a joyful reminder that our salvation is near. On this Gaudete Sunday, this gospel invites us to reflect on something unique as the foundation of the source of our Joy: Sharing what we have as a source of God's justice for the poor. Today, the third Sunday of Advent, let us remind ourselves that the true sense of joy is sharing what we can with those in need. In the gospel, the crowd asks the prophet John the Baptist, "What should we do?" the prophet responds by inviting them to stop amassing unnecessary stuff as they wait for Jesus' coming: Stop collecting more than what is prescribed. Be open and let us share what we have. We are invited to make this advent the most pedagogical spiritual season of our lives, where we can learn how to wait and meet Christ in others.

We pray that this Jubilee Year strengthen our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in our daily lives, and that it may transform us into pilgrims of Christian hope.
