





### TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "He shall stand firm and shepherd his flock by the strength of the Lord." (Mi 5:1-4a)

The Fourth Sunday of Advent— The 4th Sunday of Advent holds profound significance as it represents the final stage of anticipation and preparation for the arrival of Christmas. This day is marked by the lighting of the fourth candle on the Advent wreath, symbolizing the imminent arrival of the long-awaited Messiah. The lighting of the fourth candle signifies the virtue of love, encapsulating the essence of Christ's message to humanity. As the fourth candle is illuminated, it serves as a poignant reminder of the boundless love that God bestowed upon the world through the gift of His Son. This act of divine love is at the heart of the Christmas narrative, underscoring the profound significance of the Nativity and the transformative impact it has had on humanity throughout the ages.
