


TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance." (Is 60:1-6)

Psalm — "All kings shall pay him homage, all nations shall serve him." (Ps 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13)

Second Reading — "The Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel." (Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6)

Gospel — "They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother." (Mt 2:1-12)

The Feast of the Epiphany-The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, also known as Three Kings Day, falls on Sunday, January 5, 2025. In the Catholic tradition, Epiphany was always celebrated on January 6. Beginning with the 1970 liturgical year (which commenced on November 30,1969), the feast was moved in the United States to the first Sunday following January 1. This holy day marks the arrival of the Magi to worship the Baby Jesus and the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as the Savior of the world. The term "Epiphany," based on the Greek word meaning "manifestation" or "revelation," commemorates key events in the life of Christ: the visitation of the Three Wise Men, the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan, and Christ's first public miracle at Cana. Each reflects a moment of divine revelation.
