

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "And suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek, and the messenger of the covenant you desire.." (Malachi 3:1-4)

Psalm — "Lift up, O gates, your lintels; reach up, you ancient portals, that the king of glory may come in." (Ps 24:7,8,9,10)

Second Reading — "Because he himself was tested through what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested" (Heb 2:14-18)

Gospel — "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples..." (Luke 2:22-40)

St Agatha St Agatha was a native of Sicily, and descended of a noble and opulent family. From her very early years, the notably beautiful Agatha dedicated her life to God. She became a consecrated virgin, a state in life where young women choose to remain celibate and give themselves wholly to Jesus and the Church in a life of prayer and service. Many sought the affection of Agatha, one potential suitor as a man named Quintianus. He was a high ranking diplomat who thought he could get Agatha to turn away from her vows and force her to marry him. After many failed attempts to sway Agatha, he had her imprisoned and later tortured as Agatha would not turn away from her faith. Agatha was martyred around the year 251. St Agatha is the patron saint of Sicily, bellfounders, breast cancer patients, Palermo, rape victims, and wet nurses. Her feast day is celebrated on February 5.
