

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is in the Lord." (Jer 17:5-8)

Psalm — "For the Lord watches over the way of the just, but the way of the wicked vanishes." (Ps 1:1-2,3,4 & 6)

Second Reading — "But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep." (1 Cor 15:1-2, 16-20)

Gospel — "Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold your reward will be great in heaven." (Luke 6:17, 20-26)

<u>St. Peter</u>— St. Peter, who was also known as Simon Peter of Cephas, is considered the first Pope. Peter was a native of Bethsaida, and was the son of Jonah. He and his brother Andrew were fishermen on Lake Genesareth. The Bible chronicles when the brothers met Jesus in Luke chapter 5 where he invited Peter, Andrew and brothers James & John (the sons of Zebedee) to be his first disciples. Peter was known for his "little faith". He denied knowing Jesus 3 times during Jesus' passion. But Peter was also the first of the apostles to acknowledge Jesus as the Christ when Jesus posed the questions to the disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" It was here that Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter. Jesus told Peter that he would be the rock (Cephas) on which his church would be built. St. Peter is often pictured as an elderly man holding a key (to heaven's entrance) and a book (the book of life).
