





TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint...." (Isaiah 50:4-7)

Psalm — "They divide my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots." (Ps 22:8-9,17-18,19-20,23-24)

Second Reading — "Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed upon him the name that is above every name.." (Philippians 2:6-11)

Gospel — "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22:14-23:56)

Good Friday Nine Church Walk Pilgrimage- The Nine Church Walk is closely associated with an ancient Roman Practice of visiting 7 churches on the Evening of Holy Thursday. There are at least sixteen Catholic churches in the Archdiocese of New Orleans where pilgrims are welcomed and invited to spend the day prayerfully reflecting on the Lord's suffering and death on Good Friday. Of special note, although several of these churches are designated as jubilee pilgrimage churches, on Good Friday, all of these churches will be jubilee pilgrimage sites as the journey itself is one of pilgrimage. Those who complete or make any part of the pilgrimage can gain the Jubilee Year indulgence.
