TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead." (Acts 10:34, 37-43)

Psalm — "The right hand of the Lord has struck with power; the right hand of the Lord be exalted." (Ps 118: 1-2,16-17, 22-23)

Second Reading — "Brothers and sisters: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above." (Col 3:1-4)

Gospel — "Then the other disciple went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed." (John 20:1-9)

Divine Mercy Sunday-The Sunday after Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday a Day of Extraordinary Grace. All of Lent is a preparation for the most important feast of Easter, but we actually celebrate it over eight full days, which is why we call it the Octave of Easter. The Second Sunday of Easter, Mercy Sunday is the last day of the octave, the eighth day. In a series of revelations to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, Our Lord repeatedly called for the celebration of the Feast of Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. "Ordinarily, only the sacrament of Baptism effects in the soul the 'complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.' Reception of the Eucharist in a state of grace ordinarily remits only venial sin, strengthening the soul against both venial and mortal sin. But on Mercy Sunday reception of Holy Communion worthily and with trust in God's Mercy pours out upon the soul a complete renewal of baptismal grace."
