

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "Many signs and wonders were done among the people at the hands of the apostles." (Acts 5:12-16)

Psalm — "The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." (Ps 118: 2-4,3-15, 22-24)

Second Reading — "Do not be afraid. I am the first, I am the last, the one who lives." (Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19)

Gospel — "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, whose sins you retain are retained." (John 20:19-31)

<u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u>-The Sunday after Easter is Divine Mercy Sunday a Day of Extraordinary Grace. All of Lent is a preparation for the most important feast of Easter, but we actually celebrate it over eight full days, which is why we call it the Octave of Easter. The Second Sunday of Easter, Mercy Sunday is the last day of the octave, the eighth day. In a series of revelations to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, Our Lord repeatedly called for the celebration of the Feast of Mercy on the first Sunday after Easter. "Ordinarily, only the sacrament of Baptism effects in the soul the 'complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.' Reception of the Eucharist in a state of grace ordinarily remits only venial sin, strengthening the soul against both venial and mortal sin. But on Mercy Sunday reception of Holy Communion worthily and with trust in God's Mercy pours out upon the soul a complete renewal of baptismal grace."
