

The devotion to the Sacred Heart has deep roots in the 17th century, when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received visions of Jesus revealing his Sacred Heart. These visions led to the establishment of the <u>Feast of the Sacred Heart</u>, which is a significant celebration in the liturgical calendar. During June, Catholics are encouraged to engage in various devotional practices to honor the Sacred Heart, including: First Friday devotions, observing the Holy Hour, Daily Prayer and Acts of reparation.

<u>Christmas in July</u>—The Marian Sodality will be hosting a hygiene drive for Christmas in July to benefit the Rebuild Center. Travel size toiletry items are needed to make hygiene kits for guests who use the showers at the center. Shampoo, conditioner, mouthwash, body wash, toothpaste, deodorant, lotion, hand sanitizer are examples of needed items. Donations will start to be collected next Sunday.
