

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading —"Peter thus was being kept in prison, but prayer by the Church was fervently being made to God on his behalf." (Acts 12:1-11)

Psalm — "Let my soul glory in the Lord; the lowly will hear me and be glad." (Ps 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9)

Second Reading —"I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith." (2Tim 4:6-8, 17-18)

Gospel —"And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." (Mt 16:13-19)

Ordinary Time in the Church—The summer months are upon us and the church is entering ordinary time. Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ.. We are reminded of this conversion each Sunday and daily Mass with green altar clothes and clerical vestments.

Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life, and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.
