

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "See how I am presuming to speak to my Lord, though I am but dust and ashes!" (Gen 18:20-32)

Psalm — "The Lord is exalted, yet the lowly he see, and the proud he knows from afar." (Ps 138:1-2, 2-3, 6-7, 7-8)

Second Reading — "You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God." (Col 2:12-14)

Gospel —"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; see and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." (Lk 11:1-13)

St Ignatius Loyola—St. Ignatius of Loyola, born in 1491 in Loyola, Spain. Early in life he had a strong ambition for military glory. But in 1521, while serving in the Spanish army, Ignatius's life took a drastic turn in the siege of Pamplona. A cannonball severely injured his leg, shattering his dreams of a military career. During his recovery, Ignatius sought books to pass the time. He read "Life of Christ" and a collection of the "Lives of the Saints." As he read, Ignatius experienced a profound inner transformation. In Manresa, he immersed himself in prayer and reflection, seeking to discernment from God. During this time, he composed the "Spiritual Exercises," a guide for spiritual growth and discernment. Loyola completed his theological studies in preparation for the priesthood in Paris and it was there that he formed the religious order the Society of Jesus, known as the Jesuits. His feast day is July 31st.
