




TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading—"For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun?" (Ecc 1:2,2:21-23)

Psalm — "Teach us to number our days aright that we may gain wisdom of heart." (Ps 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17)

Second Reading — "When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory." (Col 3:1-5,9-11)

Gospel —"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." (Lk 12:13 -21)

St Dominic—Saint Dominic was born in Caleruega, Spain in 1170. It is known that Dominic was educated in Palencia where he spent six years studying theology and four the arts. In 1191, a famine left many people desolate and homeless across Spain. Dominic sold everything he had, including his furniture and clothes and bought food for the poor. In 1194, Dominic joined a Benedictine order. Pope Innocent III tasked Dominic to go to southern France, the region of Languedoc, to convert heretics back to the true faith. Dominic traveled throughout the region, preaching and converting many back to Catholic Christian faith and practice. Dominic created his own order dedicated to promoting morality and the expulsion of heresy. He and his followers were dubbed The Order of Preachers. St Dominic is the patron saint of astronomers and the innocent who are falsely accused. His feast day is August 8th.
