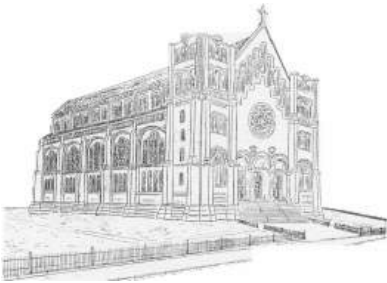

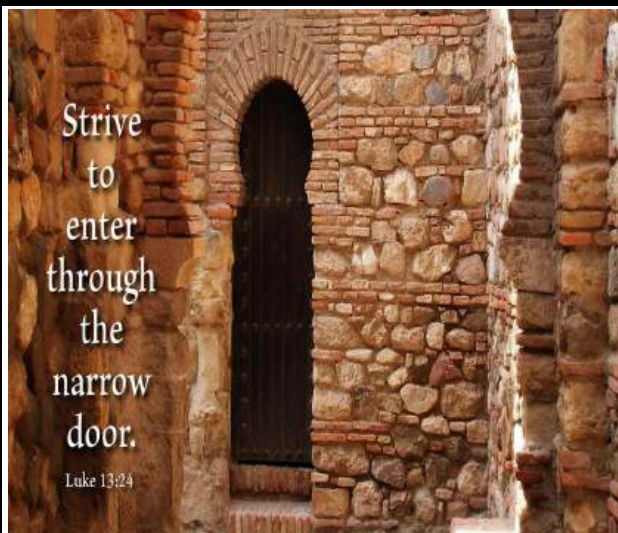

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — "I know their works and their thoughts, and I come to gather nations of every language; they shall come and see my glory." (Is 66:18-21)

Psalm — "For steadfast is his kindness towards us and the fidelity of the Lord endures forever." (Ps 117:1,2)

Second Reading — "Do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him" (Heb 12:5-7, 11-13)

Gospel — "For behold, some are the last who will be first, and some are first who will be last" (Lk 13:22-30)

St. Augustine- St. Augustine of Hippo was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in unholy living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent ever and though he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and his pride darkened his mind so much, that he could not see or understand the Divine Truth anymore. Through the prayers of his holy mother, St. Monica and the preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. He soon picked up the book of the Letters of St. Paul, and read the first passage. It was just what Augustine needed, for in it, St. Paul says to put away all impurity and to live in imitation of Jesus. He was baptized, became a priest, a bishop, a famous Catholic writer, Founder of religious priests. Pope Leo belongs to the Augustinian Order of priests. His feast day is Aug 28th,
