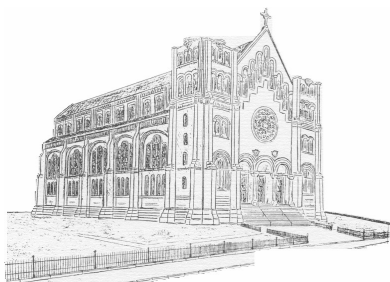

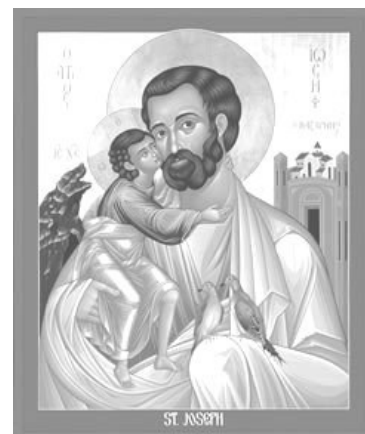

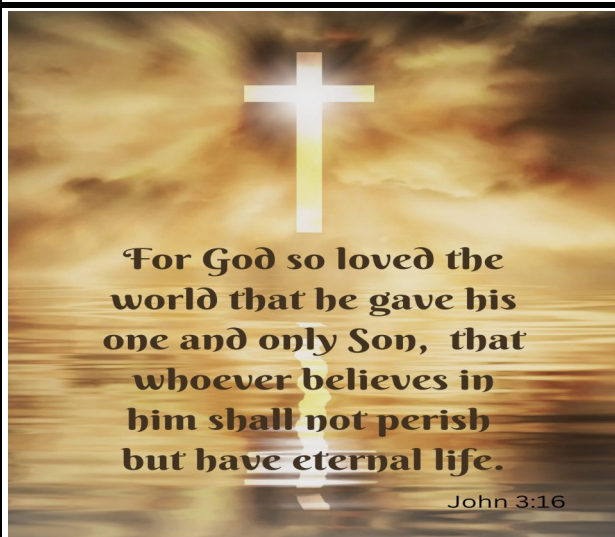

### **TODAY’S READINGS**

**First Reading** — “We have sinned in complaining against the Lord and you.” (Num 21:4b-9)

**Psalm** — “I will open my mouth in a parable, I will utter mysteries of old.” (Ps 78:1bc-2, 34-35, 36-37, 38)

**Second Reading** — “He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross” (Phi 2:6-11)

**Gospel** — “No one has gone up to heaven except the one who has come down from heaven, the Son of Man.” (John 3:13-17)

**The Exaltation of the Cross-** Exaltation of the Holy Cross, liturgical feast celebrated on September 14 to honor the cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified. In the Eastern churches the feast dates back to the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (the site of Christ’s tomb) in Jerusalem circa 335. It was adopted by the Roman Catholic Church in the 7th century. Early in the fourth century, Saint Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ’s life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior’s tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that spot. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman.
