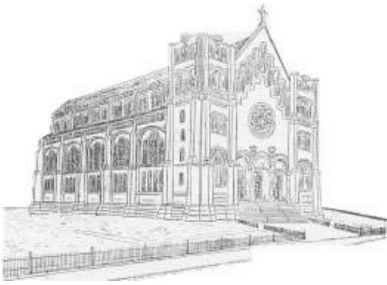

Please call the church office if your loved one is hospitalized or shut-in and unable to attend Mass for *the Anointing of the Sick* for healing and to receive communion.

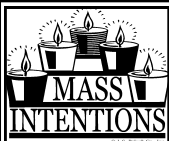

A Heartfelt Thank You— Last Sunday was the inaugural collection of the Regina Fulton fund. This fund was established to honor the service and legacy of longtime St Joseph Church receptionist, Gina Fulton as she retired from her position at the end of June. Gina worked daily in what she called “the window ministry” helping people in need that would come in looking for respite and aid. One of the growing requests was for money for bus fare. The church has been supplying bus passes for people that will allow them to get around town. In Gina’s honor, annually on the 15th Sunday of ordinary time we will have a second collection and the money collected will be used to purchase bus passes for those in need. For our first effort, over \$1500 was raised. Thank you so much for your generous contribution. We will do it again next year. God bless Gina in her retirement.
