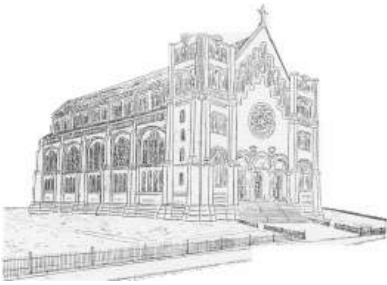

Please call the church office if your loved one is hospitalized or shut-in and unable to attend Mass for *the Anointing of the Sick* for healing and to receive communion.

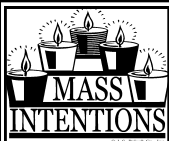

To mark St Vincent's dedication to serving the needs of the most vulnerable people we will have a household goods drive to benefit the Society of St Vincent dePaul. We will collect for 3 Sundays and a special liturgy and reception will be held after both masses on Sunday 9/27.
